FURTHER RESOLVED, that Worcester Township shall not be responsible for the design, installation or inspection of any sewer lines or related facility with respect to the Hollis Hills Subdivision and that Worcester Township shall not accept dedication of nor assume any responsibility for the operation and/or maintenance of sewer lines and related facilities in the Hollis Hills Subdivision.

RESOLUTION NO. 88-2

WORCESTER TOWNSHIP MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

RESOLUTION FOR PLAN REVISION

Resolution of the Supervisors of Worcester Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania (hereinafter "the municipality").

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Act of January 24, 1966, P.L. 1535, No. 537, known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act," as amended, and the rules and regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources (Department) adopted thereunder, Chapter 71 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Code, require the municipality to adopt an Official Sewage Facilities Plan providing for sewage services adequate to prevent contamination of waters and/or environmental health hazards with sewage wastes, and to revise said plan whenever it is necessary to determine whether a proposed method of sewage disposal for a new development conforms to a comprehensive program of pollution control and water quality management, and

WHEREAS, Robert Frisbie has proposed the development of a parcel of land identified as The Frisbie Tract, and described in the attached Planning Module for Land Development, and prposes that such subdivision be served by community sewage systems, and

WHEREAS, the municipality has reviewed the Planning Module for Land Development for the proposed subdivision and has determined that the proposed method of sewage disposal does not conform to and is not included in the approved "Official Plan" of the municipality Act 537 Plan for Worcester Township, and

WHEREAS, Worcester Township has reviewed the attached Planning Module for Land Development and the subdivision to be serviced by the proposed community sewage sytem and finds: (1) that for the purposes of sewage facilities planning, the proposed revision to the Worcester Township Official Sewage Facilities Plan is acceptable in concept subject to compliance with the requirements of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit and the requirements of the Department for a sewage plant and sewer extension permit; and (2) that the proposed subdivision in the form of a tentative sketch plan is in general compliance with the applicable zoning and subdivision regulations of Worcester Township subject to compliance with the additional requirements thereof for approval of preliminary and final subdivision plans and compliance with a comprehensive program of pollution control and water quality management.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Supervisors of Worcester Township hereby adopt and submit to the Department of Environmental Resources for its approval on the terms recited above as a revision to the "Official Plan" of the municipality the above-referenced Planning Module for Land Development which is attached hereto, without prejudice, however, to the authority of Worcester Township to contest any and all future actions of Robert Frisbie and/or the Department in the review and/or approval of an NPDES permit and sewage plant and sewer extension permit and with the clear understanding that Worcester Township will not serve as the project sponsor, nor as the permittee for the sewage plant and/or sewage facilities proposed by the plan revision hereby approved.
