Watershed Protection Tip On-Lot Septic Systems

A leaking on-lot septic system can leach harmful bacteria into storm sewer systems and local waterways. Keeping septic systems well-maintained both protects the local aquifer and prevents costly repairs.

Days Gone By

For many years a creamery operated in the building currently located directly opposite the Worcester Volunteer Fire Station on Valley Forge Road. According to an 1881 record book more than 80 local farmers hauled milk to this creamery each day. Farmers received between two and four cents per quart delivered, depending on the season.

5TH ANNUAL WORCESTER TOWNSHIP FOOD DRIVE

It's that time of year again... 'tis the season for giving! Last year we received an overwhelming response from residents, businesses and community organizations to assist those in need. And in 2020 there will likely be even more families who need our help.

Food items can be dropped off at the Township Building, 1721 Valley Forge Road, Monday to Friday, 7:00 am to 4:30 pm. The last date to drop-off donations is Thursday, November 19.

For residents who want to give, but are unable to stop by the Township Building during normal business hours, the Township is offering two convenient pick-up days! Just leave your donation in a paper bag at the front door, and we'll do the rest. Pick-ups must be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance of collection.

The two pick-up days are...

- Thursday, November 5
- Thursday, November 12

To schedule a pick-up call the Township Building at (610) 584-1410. All food collected will be donated to the local Salvation Army Food Cupboard.

SUBDIVISION & LAND DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The following projects are now under review:

- **Palmer** - Seven commercial lots and one residential parcel at Skippack Pike & Valley Forge Road.
- **Palmer Village** - An eleven lot single-family detached subdivision, with a bank, convenience store, and pharmacy, at Skippack Pike & Valley Forge Road.

The following subdivision and land development projects are among those receiving approval in the recent years, and construction has not yet begun:

- **Blue Eagle Properties** - A 1,600 sf addition to an existing office building at Germantown Pike.
- **Meadowood** - Two generator units to service an existing retirement community at Skippack Pike.
- **Meadowood** - A 4,200 sf addition for administrative offices and resident amenities at an existing retirement community at Skippack Pike.

- **Sparango Construction** - An eight single-family detached home subdivision at Berks Road.
- **Stony Creek Village** - Office, retail, and restaurant buildings at North Wales Road & Township Line Road.

The following approved subdivision and land development projects are now under construction:

- **Mazz Properties** - A two-lot single family detached home subdivision at Morris Road.
- **Meadowood, The Grove** - A 52-unit age-restricted development at an existing retirement community at Skippack Pike.
- **Reserve at Center Square** - A residential subdivision at Skippack Pike that includes 125 townhomes and 125 single-family detached homes.
- **Whitehall Estates** - A 39 single-family detached home subdivision at Whitehall Road.

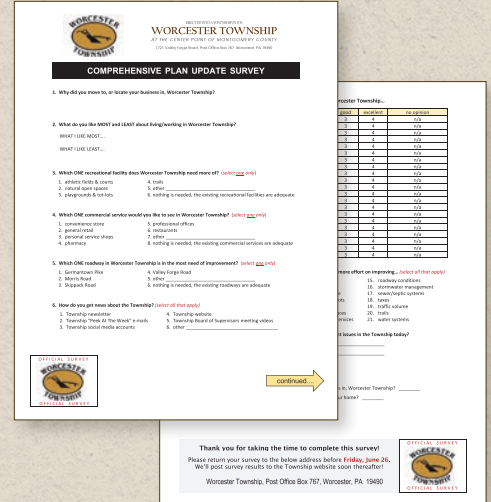
Recycling Ideas Plastic Bags

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN SURVEY RESULTS

The Worcester Township Comprehensive Plan serves as the primary planning tool for our community. The Comprehensive Plan helps to guide growth and land preservation, natural resource protection, traffic management, infrastructure improvement, the provision of utilities, fiscal sustainability, and other issues that affect our community.

State Law requires every municipality to review its comprehensive plan every ten years, and earlier this year the Board of Supervisors appointed a 17-member Task Force to prepare and recommend updates to our plan. The first step in the update process is conducting a community survey... asking residents and business owners for their thinking on what matters most in our Township.

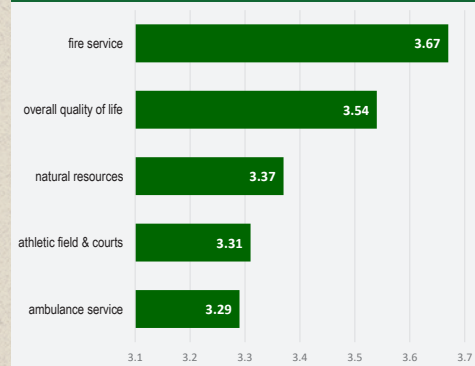

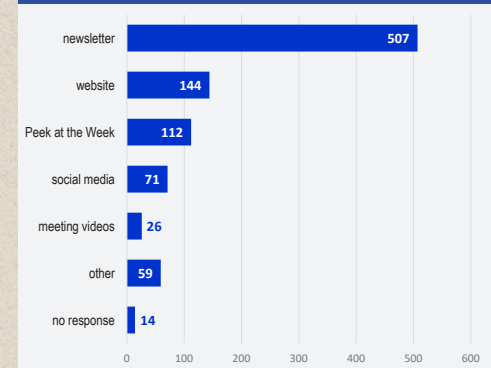
About Our Survey:

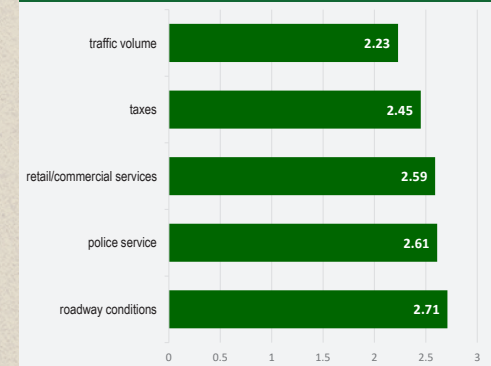
Rate the PRESENT QUALITY of the following... TOP 5 rated; scale 1 to 4



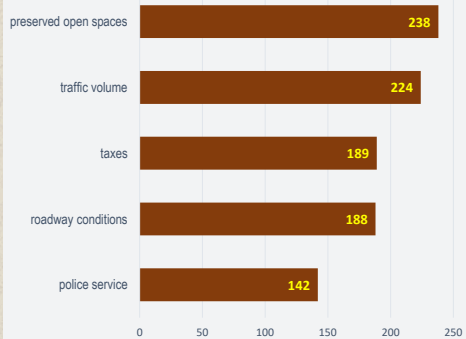
How do you get NEWS about the Worcester Township? select all that apply



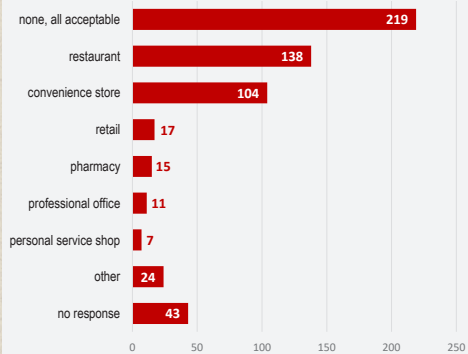
Rate the PRESENT QUALITY of the following... BOTTOM 5 rated; scale 1 to 4

Which one COMMERCIAL SERVICE would you like to see in Worcester Township?



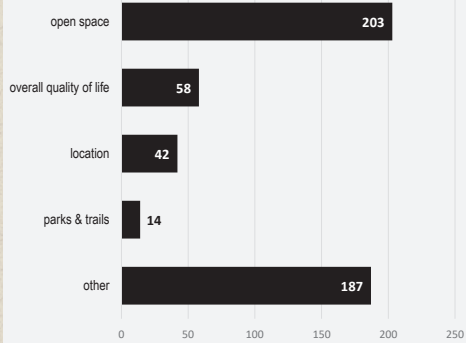
Ask Mary Ann

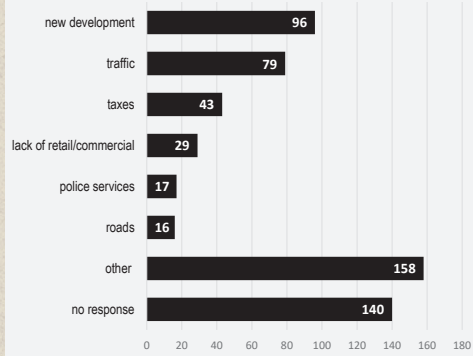
RESIDENT: "Does Worcester Township require a permit to re-shingle a roof?"

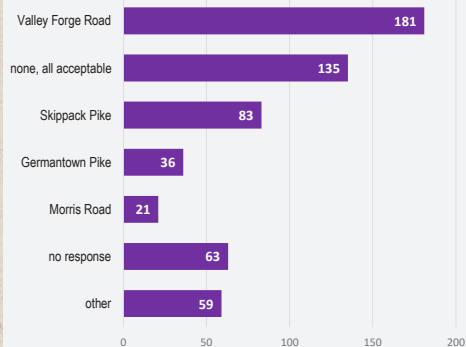
What do you like MOST ABOUT LIVING/WORKING in Worcester Township?



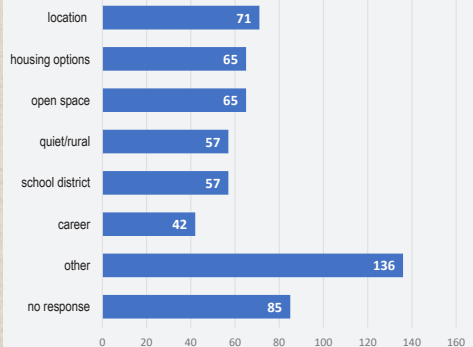
What do you like LEAST ABOUT LIVING/WORKING in Worcester Township?



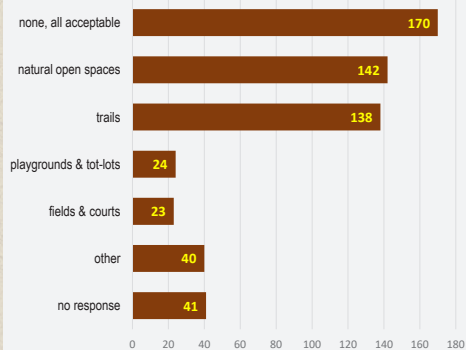
Which one ROADWAY is in the most need of improvement?

VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS HOURS LOGGED

Through the first six months of 2020, the men and women of the Worcester Volunteer Fire Department logged **2,579 hours** conducting drills and responding to calls for help. If these folks were paid firefighters, the estimated cost to Worcester taxpayers for the same number of service hours would total about **\$275,953**.

And if the Township were to employ a full-time paid fire department this cost would top \$2 million per year, or about \$180 for each person now living in Worcester!

Making Cents

Saving taxpayer money, it's one of the things Worcester Township does best! Here's another example of a step we're taking today to keep our financial position secure tomorrow.

What we do...

Utilize online auctions to sell used equipment and other items no longer needed by the Township.

The background...

State Law requires that all municipalities sell certain items by public auction. Townships and boroughs must publish a legal ad in a local newspaper (*the ads no one reads*) that establish a process for the submission and opening of bids.

The step taken...

While not required to do so, Worcester posts its used items to a popular online auction site, thereby maximizing exposure among potential purchasers. The increase in bidders typically yields higher bids, and higher bids increase the percent of the item's original purchase price recovered by the Township.
