This edition of your Worcester Crier marks the tenth year of bringing information to you in this newsletter format. Following is a brief report on the current status of the township. The township also has an official web site, www.worcestertwp.com, which is updated regularly, offering a great deal of additional information.

The township's financial condition is very solid, and we have been able to maintain our present real estate tax rate of .05 mils, or \$5.00 per \$100,000, for more than ten years. Within our budget, we repave some township roads every year and almost all township roads are presently in good to excellent condition. The worst, in Fairview Village, where sewers were installed last year, will be finish-paved later this year.

The township is also engaged in a continuing effort to preserve open space and minimize development. We have been very successful in these efforts. We have done this primarily by leveraging township money in combination with available state and county funds. While

your supervisors recognize the value of, and interest in, open space preservation, they also realize that there are many other demands for township funds, and work to balance the various interests and needs of all residents and meet all of our obligations.

The township's Heebner Park is fully functioning and well utilized. It features walking trails, soccer, multi-purpose, baseball and softball fields, picnic tables and a gazebo as well as a play area. It was planned by an ad hoc committee of residents, with the assistance of a professional consultant, and with input from the public at numerous meetings. Those residents who have never visited the park are encouraged to do so. We have also made provisions for future growth of Heebner Park by acquiring adjacent property that would have otherwise gone to development.

Credit card payment is now accepted for many things including park and recreation activities and the payment of sewer bills.

Our Worcester Volunteer Fire Department is a wonderful asset to the

township because of the hard work of its many volunteers and the financial support of the community and the township.

The Worcester Historical Society has recently experienced growth and revitalization. It has an expanded program of activities, many of which are utilizing one of our historical buildings, the Farmers Union Hall.

Worcester Township continues to be a great place to live, as we all know, as is evidenced by the pressure for development, and real estate values. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the many volunteers who contribute their time and efforts to their community to make it as great as it is.

UK ELITE SOCCER

July 18-22

Ages 3-5, 9-10:30am, \$95

Referred to as "tee ball for golf", the SNAG coaching system allows younger golfers the opportunity to gain confidence and see results much faster than traditional golf. Full swing, pitching, chipping, putting, rules and etiquette are covered in both classes. Students are broken into groups based on age and ability. Students receive a t-shirt, water bottle, trophy, rules book, evaluation and certificate of completion. The student-to-teacher ratio is 6:1. Golfers should bring a baseball cap or visor, snacks, shoes and sunscreen. Junior golfers are encouraged to bring their own clubs, if they have them.

ICE CREAM SUNDAE SUNDAY

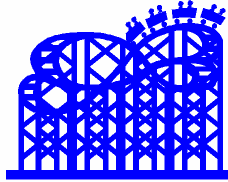

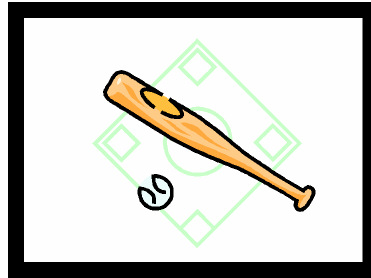

Yard Sale & Temporary Sign Permits

With summer quickly approaching, Worcester Township wants to remind residents of our policies on garage sales and temporary signs.

All yard and garage sales require a permit from the township. The license fee is \$5, plus a \$50 deposit to guarantee that all posted signs advertising the event will be discarded after the sale. No signs or handbills may be posted on utility poles or street sign posts within the township.

Yard sale permit requests must be completed a minimum of two weeks prior to the scheduled sale and only one person and/or property can hold a sale in a given calendar year.

The permit form may be picked up at the township building, or printed directly from our web site (www.worcestertwp.com).



In residential districts of the township, commercial vendors (painters, contractors, landscapers, etc.) may place a sign on the property where work is being completed, provided the sign is no greater than 15 square feet in area, and that is removed promptly upon completion of the work.

Signs advertising a property for

sale or rental, may not exceed 10 square feet in area. Only one sign is permitted for each broker on the premises being advertised unless that property fronts upon more than one street or road. In that case, no more than one sign for each broker or party interested in the sale or rental shall be erected on each frontage, up to a maximum of four total signs.

Signs bearing the words "sold" or "rented" are permitted in residential districts, provided that the sign is removed within 10 days of the effective date of the sale or rental.

The Montgomery County-Norristown Public Library offers a variety of services to residents of Worcester Township.

The bookmobile is in Worcester Township every other Monday at Fairview Village and every other Friday at Bethel & Morris Roads.

Individuals can request books online, and have them delivered to the local bookmobile site.

This year's summer reading program for kids is "Dragons, Dreams and Daring Deeds." Children up to age 18 are eligible to register for this

program, where after every 10th book they read, each child's name will be entered into a drawing for a prize book. Children must register for the program in advance.

The library also offers a free Books-by-Mail program to housebound residents of Montgomery County.
