Lane Restrictions Scheduled on North Wales Road and Morris Road for Intersection Realignment

King of Prussia – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) today announced that lane restrictions are scheduled on North Wales Road and Morris Road in Worcester, Upper Gwynedd, and Whitpain townships, Montgomery County, to realign the intersection of these two roads.

The work schedule is:

- Tuesday through Saturday (May 31-June 4) – One lane will be closed on northbound and southbound North Wales Road between Route 73 and Cardinal Way from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.; and
- Tuesday through Saturday (May 31-June 4) – One lane will be closed on eastbound and westbound Morris Road between DeKalb Pike and West Point Pike from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

North Wales Road closed April 27 between Route Whitehall Way and Morris Road for road reconstruction. During construction, North Wales Road through traffic is detoured over Route 73 (Skippack Pike), Bethel Road, and Morris Road. Motorists are advised to allow extra time when traveling through the area. This section of North Wales Road will reopen July 31.

Crews are working to eliminate two existing T-intersections and create a single four-way signalized intersection. The contractor will also resurface the roadway approaches; widen the roadway to provide right and left turn lanes; improve drainage; pavement markings; and signing.

During construction, there will be two separate traffic detours. Local access will be maintained up to the construction zone.

Allan A. Myers, LP, of Worcester, Pa, is the general contractor on the \$1,790,282 project that is financed with 80 percent federal and 20 percent state funds. The project is expected to be completed by November 2011.
