## HOLIDAY RECYCLING TIPS

Here are some recycling tips to keep in mind during the holiday season:

- Use wrapping paper that is made with recycled materials, which can also be recycled after the gift is unwrapped.
- Put out the recycling bin during parties. Make it easier for guests to recycle their glass bottles and aluminum cans by putting the recycling bin next to the trash can.
- Holiday Lights and tinsel are not recyclable. Please make sure to remove these before recycling your trees. Some home improvement stores have bins available to recycle old holiday lights.
- Recycle your cardboard. Break down any cardboard and place in your recycling bin.
- Bring your own shopping bags. If you do use plastic bags, please

return them to the grocery stores and recycle them. Plastic bags should not be placed in your recycling bins!

• Recycle your old gadgets.

Get a new phone or computerremember to recycle your old electronics either by taking it to a store that will accept it or by using retrievr, a service that will pick up items for recycling. Some items may have a fee charged for pick-up. # **Holiday Tree Drop-Off**

Worcester Township will again host a holiday tree drop-off location. Trees can be taken to the branch drop-off site at Nike Park, 1575 North Trooper Road, just south of Potshop Road.

Trees and greens may be droppedoff anytime between December 26 and January 31. Please place trees adjacent to the sign located in the parking area.

Since we recycle the trees into mulch, all stands, ornaments, wiring, plastic bags and tinsel must be removed.
And please note that wreaths are not accepted.

ooking to sell your property, or have questions about work that was done at a property you're looking to buy? The Township maintains a property file for nearly all properties in our community. These files commonly include building applications, permits, property plans, and general correspondence to and from the property owner.

### SAFE DISPOSAL OF FIREPLACE & WOODSTOVE ASHES

ust a reminder as you are operating your fireplace this season. Ashes from woodstoves and fireplaces must be disposed of properly to avoid fires in and around your home.



Please remember to carefully consider the type of container in which the ashes are stored. Never empty ashes into a paper or plastic bag, cardboard box, or another similar container. The only way to safely store ashes is to use a metal container with a lid. And don't forget to pour water on the ashes prior to attaching the metal lid to the pail.

Lastly, never store your metal ash container on your deck, in your garage, or in any location that may allow heat to transfer from those hot coals to nearby flammable items. Countless wooden decks catch fire each year because of this simple oversight.

# 2023 Road Program Preview

The Township completed the 2022 Road Program in October! The program repaired and resurfaced more than 3.5 miles of Township-owned roads – a significant investment in our community's roadway network. And that doesn't include the many smaller fixes made by our Public Works team throughout the year!

The Township is now preparing a list of roadways for possible repair or resurfacing in 2023.

At this time the list includes all or portions of...

- · Defford Road
- Defford Circle
- · Clyston Road
- Clyston Circle
- · Landis Road
- Bayton Road
- Bayton Circle
- Highview Drive
- Merion Way
- Anvil Drive
- Blacksmith Lane
- · A portion of Heebner Park

Please note the list is tentative. As the winter progresses Township staff will carefully monitor roadway conditions, and prioritize projects as conditions warrant.

### WINTER IS COMING — SNOW REMOVAL TIPS!

hen snow begins to fall, the Township applies a brine solution to the roadway surface to prevent the formation of ice. Our Public Works team then works to plow the roadways, following specific routes that aim to clear emergency routes and high-priority roads first. For safety reasons cul-de-sacs and other secondary roads are not plowed until all emergency routes and high-priority roads are passable.

As always, the Township will do its very best to keep roadways as clear as possible, but we need your help!



#### When the first snowflakes begin to fall, please remember to:

- Remove vehicles from the roadway until the roadway is cleared. Vehicles parked on the roadway hamper snow removal operations, and vehicles parked on emergency routes may be towed.
- Wait until the roadway is cleared before shoveling your driveway, sidewalk and mailbox area. But if you must clear these areas sooner, please know Township trucks will likely throw snow back onto these areas when plowing the road.
- Refrain from shoveling snow into the roadway.
   Pushing snow from your driveway or sidewalk into the roadway creates a safety hazard and could cause an accident.
- Prepare your vehicle for winter driving. And if you
  are too nervous about driving on snow and ice, don't
  drive. Share a ride with a neighbor, or wait until the
  roadways are cleared before traveling.

The Township does not plow County and State-owned roadways, private roadways and roadways not yet dedicated to the Township.



# PROPER PLACEMENT OF MAILBOXES

Help Reduce the Opportunity for Damage

Worcester Township takes every precaution to avoid damaging mailboxes during snow removal operations. Below are some helpful mailbox placement tips to help reduce the chance your mailbox is damaged this winter:

- Along an uncurbed roadway, a mailbox should be located 2' from the edge of pavement to provide adequate clearance.
- Along a curbed roadway, a mailbox face should be located 8" behind the curb face.
- Install the mailbox on the side of your driveway away from approaching traffic. This will lessen the likelihood of a plow strike, and minimize the shoveling needed to clear the area around the mailbox.

The Township will replace a standard mailbox and post only if either or both are struck by the plow, and only if these are installed to the specifications of the United States Postal Service (USPS).

### The USPS requires that:

- the mailbox be installed at least 42" above the roadway surface; and,
- mailbox posts not exceed 4" by 4" for wooden posts, and a 2" diameter for steel pipe posts; larger posts are deemed "deadly fixed objects", and are not permitted within the right-of-way.

The Township neither replaces nor reimburses residents for custom mailboxes or ornate posts, and the Township is not responsible for damage caused by snow or ice that is thrown from the snowplow blade.

# Melting Snow: It's Stormwater Too!

Here are some tips from the Penn State Extension for managing your property for winter stormwater:



- When piling your snow after shoveling and plowing, choose locations where the snow will have the most opportunity to infiltrate instead of becoming stormwater runoff. Pile your snow in areas where you don't usually have ponding in the spring rains, on relatively flat areas, and away from sensitive areas like streams, ponds, and your private well if you have one.
- Clear your downspouts to allow melting roof snow to flow and not collect at your foundation.
- Make sure your nearest storm drains are clear. Do not pile snow on storm drains. Clear away any snow that may have been kicked onto the drains by passing cars.
- Use de-icing chemicals and salts judiciously. Use what you need to make your walkways and driveways safe, but try to avoid spreading around sensitive areas like waterways and your private well.
- Postpone outdoor construction projects in winter, when you can't establish new vegetation to reduce soil loss and muddy runoff.
- Pay special attention to places that are eroding during snow melt, and make a plan to improve these areas in spring using plants that can slow and stop erosion, like native grasses and meadow plants or native trees and shrubs.

- Kerper-Heebner A two-lot single-family detached subdivision Heebner Road & Kriebel Mill Road.
- Palmer Seven commercial lots and one residential parcel at Skippack Pike & Valley Forge Road.
- Palmer Village An 11-lot single-family detached home subdivision, with a bank, convenience store, and pharmacy, at Skippack Pike & Valley Forge Road.
- Zacharczuk A 16-lot single-family detached home subdivision at Skippack Pike.

# The following subdivision and land development projects are among those receiving approval in the recent years, and construction has not yet begun:

- Meadowood A 4,200 sf addition for administrative offices and resident amenities at an existing retirement community at Skippack Pike.
- Sparango Construction An eight-lot single-family detached home subdivision at Berks Road.
- Stony Creek Village Office, retail, and restaurant buildings at North Wales Road & Township Line Road.

# The following approved subdivision and land development projects are now under construction:

- Meadowood A 20-bed memory care facility at an existing retirement community at Skippack Pike.
- Reserve at Center Square A residential subdivision at Skippack Pike that includes 125 townhomes and 125 single-family detached homes.
- Whitehall Estates A 39 single-family detached home subdivision at Whitehall Road.

# **OPEN BURNING REGULATIONS**

n Ordinance 2021-286, along with new recycling guidelines, there is some clarification regarding open burning. It is not permissible to burn leaves, yard waste, or other materials in Worcester Township.



### Exceptions to allow open fire and burning is as follows:

- Burning shall be permitted for fire-fighting training by Township-designated fire-fighting organizations conditioned on prior approval of the Worcester Township Fire Marshal.
- Burning shall be permitted for recreational and entertainment purposes, such as bonfires and camp-fires, conditioned on prior approval of the Worcester Township Fire Marshal. Fire pits, fire bowls, and chimeneas may be used without Fire Marshal approval provided these are used in accordance with the manufacturer's safety guidelines.
- When approved by a government agency only, burning is permitted for (a) the prevention and control of disease or pests, (2) the conservation and management of unique and natural areas, (3) the prevention or abatement of a fire hazard, (4) a management technique for preventing wildfires, scientific research, or vegetation management, or (5) for agricultural uses and purposes as permitted by State Law.

Beyond the monthly curbside collection of leaf and yard waste once implemented, to properly dispose of leaf and yard waste, please contact Barnside Compost Facility, a DEP-approved dropoff location in Schwenksville at 610-287-8880 or visit their website, www.barnsidefarm.com, for more information.

The Township offers a location for tree branch drop-off. The branches are chipped up and made into mulch that is free to all Township Residents. For more details, please see page 2.

### **VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS HOURS LOGGED**

hrough the first nine months of 2021, the men and women of the Worcester Volunteer Fire Department logged 6,613 hours conducting drills and responding to calls for help. If these folks were paid



firefighters, the estimated cost to Worcester taxpayers for the same number of service hours would total about \$707,591.

And if the Township were to employ a *full-time* paid fire department this cost would top \$2 million per year, or about \$180 for each person now living in Worcester!

Our volunteer firefighters may not be paid, but maintaining a dependable volunteer fire department isn't free. The Worcester Volunteer Fire Department is always looking for persons who can help protect our community.
